Second. — Si j'ai bonne mémoire, Votre Paternité
m'avait demandé jadis la Charte de fondation de la Char-
trouse de Perth, en Ecosse. — Je ne l'avais pas en ce moment,
car elle ne se trouve ni dans le Monasticon Scoticum, ni
dans le Rental Book de la Charterhouse. Je ne l'ai pas
non plus trouvée depuis, même dans les Registres du Grand
Trésor d'Ecosse. Mais j'ai retrouvé tout de même quelque
chose, c'est une Confirmation de Jacques V, reproduisant en
grande partie la Charte primitive; il se trouve dans les
Registres du Grand-Trésor d'Ecosse, à la date 1538. Les
éditeurs, aiant que je ne suis venu, font observer que
la Charte primitive n'a pu être retrouvée. En tout cas ils

Dare de Henri VIII, qui sont à la bibliothèque, et dans les quatre
monographies assez nombreuses qui se trouvent ibidem. J'avais
commencé à les dépouiller méthodiquement lorsque je suis venu
à Bourmou. Ce sera pour plus tard, quand enfin on sera sorti
de la galère de l'empire. — Les archives belges
choisissent un peu en ce moment — parce que nous sommes oc-
cupés à la bibliothèque de Damp, du reste je ne m'en suis ja-
mais occupé qu'à temps perdu, parce que les gros bouquets

veulent en finir au plus vite avec les tables du 25^e vol, qui
attendent depuis une dizaine d'années. — Dans ma précédente
lettre, qui ne Vous est pas arrivée, je Vous avais envoyé tout
un stock de notes et de dates concernant la Chartreuse de
Remondet, la liste des prieurs, des vicaires, des procureurs de la
Maison, tels qu'on les trouve dans les actes de vente et d'achat,
et le personnel de l'Etat-Major de ladite Maison, depuis 1680
jusqu'en 1784. — Je n'ai pas le temps de vous en parler
travail aujourd'hui; mais nous y reviendrons prochainement.
Soyez assez bon pour me répondre sur la question Bolvic, et
puis nous repiguerons sur la question Rusmondet. —

Ici à ~~Remondet~~, beaucoup de chaleur, beaucoup de jous-
sance, beaucoup de soif, beaucoup de vacarme et de ten-
tation, beaucoup de ballons et d'aéroplanes, beaucoup

The Carthusian monastery or Charterhouse.

Translations and abridgments of the charters of the « Prior et conventus domus Vallis virtutis ordinis Carthusiensis, prope Burghum de Perth, » or « the prior and convent of the house of the Valley of virtue of the Carthusian order near the Burgh of Perth. » - I. aus dem noten und charters: « Now belonging to the Hospital of King ^{James} VI, at Perth. » of page 91 il dit qu'il y a deux ledit hospital: « Ninety-two (charters) which belonged to the Carthusians. »

1. 1486, 19 Aug. — Letter of William, prior of great Chartreux (sic) near Grenoble, in Dauphiny, to James I, dated 19th August 1426, expressing his own and his convent's consent to the erection of a Carthusian monastery at Perth. —

To the most serene and dread Sovereign Lord the King of Scots, Friar William, the Reverend ~~the~~ Prior of the House of Great Chartreux, of the diocese, of Grenoble, presents his suppliant reverence, with all religious courtesy, and with the salutary suffrage of humble prayers.

Authorized ~~by~~ the general chapter, whose duties we bear upon our conscience, we, by the tenor of these presents, impart and grant to you authority and consent formerly demanded of us by your serene Highness, to erect and construct one House of our order within your Kingdom, near to the burgh of Perth, for the accommodation of thirteen monks and their competent number of servants, who shall there serve God perpetually, for the remed of the soul of your serene Majesty, of the soul of the renowned Lady your Consort, and of the souls of your heirs, predecessors, and successors.

This House you consequently grant to endow with two hundred marks current in your Kingdom, and to guard with privileges and liberties competent to the order, attentive that the Place itself shall with all due proportion sufficiently correspond to the arrangement of our order.

Order, as have been related to us by our venerable brother Prior of Mount of Grace^(a), and by Dean Bryce, professor of the same House, who, at our command, carefully surveyed the Place with their own eyes.

We trust that, under the blessing of God, the said structure, with the endowment suitable to royal munificence, shall soon be carried on to a good issue. Moreover, if your serene Highness desires the presence of two monks, who may give more certain information for concerning those buildings which best correspond to the fashion and form of our order, we now write partly of that matter to the said prior of the Mount of Grace, as is more largely contained in the letters addressed to him, sent along with these to your Royal Majesty. — Given at Chartreux^{use} (sic), the nineteenth day of the month of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand four hundred twenty-six, under the authentic seal of the said House, in witness of the premises. —

(a). — The Carthusian monastery of the Mount of Grace of Ingilby, in Cleveland, Yorkshire, was founded by Thomas Holland, Duke of Surrey, in 1376.

2. 1429, 6 April. — Robert Wright, burghess of Dundee, in presence of a notary-public, constituted and ordained Richard Wright his son and heir, Thomas Fotheringhame of Powrie, and master Alexander de Guthry, conjunctly and severally, his procurators, for mortgaging, granting by the title of mortgage, and consigning by writ, a whole and entire tenement, with the pertinents, lying within the burgh of Perth, on the south side of the Bridge of Tay, between the land of Thomas de Moncrieff and the Water of Tay, to be mortgaged to any person or persons, for such price or prices as the said procurators shall be pleased to accept, who have power to put their seals to writings, and to do every thing legal and customary in such a transaction^(a). The notarial attestation written by John Idell, clerk to the diocese of St. Andrews, and by

and by imperial authority notary-public.

(a) Written on the back of charter, in an old hand - « It appears by the bounding of the same land to be now Robert Fleming's land, and has been bought by the Prior (and Monks) of Charterhouse, because they constructed the said land, and sett it in fee for £. 21 money yearly. » - In a more modern hand - « Now the heirs of James Dykes. » On the 24th of February 1429-30 Robert Wright resigned this tenement to the low Prior and Carthusian Convent.

3. 1429, 4 July. - Thomas (Anderson) de Culgask, burgher of Perth, grants to the Carthusian monastery an annual rent of eight shillings out of his croft in the New Row,⁽¹⁾ or Barke Row, without the ports of the burgh of Perth, between the land of Andrew Bisset on the North, and the common pavement or street extending to the said Carthusian House and St. Leonard's on the South. -

4. Year 1430. - Alan Thomson, burgher of Perth, sells his entire tenement, with the pertinents, lying between the King's ditch on the east, and the land of Andrew Pitscottie on the west, which land is enclosed for the use and property of the said Carthusian House, for a certain sum of money which Friar John, Governor of the said Charterhouse, in name and on the part of the most excellent Prince our Sovereign Lord, by the grace of God the most illustrious King of Scots, paid to him, in his own hand, in numbered money, in his great necessity; the whole and entire said land, with its pertinents, to be held and retained to the foresaid prior and convent of the said Charterhouse in fee and heritage for ever. - Written on the back, in a very old hand, evidently by one of the Monks - « De terra Alani Thomson, quae includitur ex parte orientali infra ambitum domus huius; » and also in an old hand - « Pro loco fundationis monasterii in fronte. » -

5. 1435, 31 March. — William, by divine permission abbot of the monastery of Stone, and the Convent of the same place, grants, for the annual payment of one pound of Wax to the convent of Stone, to + Adam Hangleside, prior of the Carthusian House, and the convent of the same House, a land or tenement in Perth. —

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6. 1437-8, 30 January. — William de Wynde, burghess of Perth, agrees to an indenture with Adam Hangleside, Prior of the Charterhouse in which the said William Wynde grants in pure and perpetual alms, for the salvation of his own soul, the soul of Elizabeth his wife, the souls of their children, predecessors and successors, and also the souls of all Christian men deceased, his whole and entire land with his pertinents, vulgarly called the croft of William de Wynde, on which (in forma) the foresaid House of the Valley of Virtue was founded, between the garden of Baldwin here on the east, the street which leads to St. Leonard's on the west, the land of Andrew de Pitscottie on the south, and a land which belonged to the late John de Spens of Bothquhopill, on which land also a part of the said House was founded, on the north. And in compensation for the said land, charitably granted to the said House as before expressed, the foresaid Prior and Convent of the said House have given and granted to the said William and Elizabeth, during the term of their lives, and to the longest-liver of them ~~two~~, the lands and crofts underwritten, with their pertinents — to-wit, that croft, with its pertinents, which is called the Haugh of St. Leonard's, as it lies in length and breadth on the south side of the Valley of Virtue⁽¹⁾; one acre of the land of St. Leonard's lying on the west side of the said Haugh, above and on the Mount; the hen-croft, with its pertinents, lying on the north side of the church of St. Leonard's; one piece of land lying next to the said church of St. Leonard's, extending downward to a certain fountain called Lethie; the Thorny Croft, lying between the church of St. Leonard's and the torrent of Craigie; one piece of the land of St. Leonard's

Leonard's which is called the Tongue, on the north side of the bridge of St. Leonard's, and near the street of the same; two ridges lying on the west side of the same street, between the land of Andrew Constable on the south, and the land of Andrew de Indermartine on the north; also of five ridges of St. Leonard's, lying on the west side of the said street, between the land of the late John Lethie on the north, and the land of Richard Harrower on the south, (2).

which croft before mentioned, granted by the said William to the said House of the Valley of Vertue, the said William bound himself and his heirs to warrant, acquit, and faithfully defend to the Prior and convent of the said House, and to their successors who shall be at the time, for ever, by all their lands and possessions.

And the same Prior and convent bound themselves to warrant, acquit and faithfully defend, to the said William, and Elizabeth his wife, and to the longer liver of them two, the land granted to them by the said prior and convent in the manner before expressed; all which lands, after the decease of the foresaid William de Wyde, and Elizabeth his wife, shall returne to the said House of the Valley, and forever remain with it, so that no farther claim shall be made concerning them, by law either civil or canonial.

(1). - From this it appears that the Friars had given the epithet of their order to the locality in which the charterhouse was erected. -

(2). - William de Wynde, on the 23^d of April 1466 renounced for a sum of money, the liferent of those lands from the Monastery. -

7. 1461, 6 July. - William de Wynde ratifies the donation of his croft to the charterhouse, and binds himself and his heirs not to contradict the donation under the penalty of £. 1060 of the usual money of Scotland, which sum, with divers other goods and moneys he had before received from the prior and convent, to induce him to make the donation of his croft.

8. 1441. — Thomas Gilbert, burgher of Perth, sells to the Carthusians Monks an annual rent of one merk out of his tenement on the south side of the North Street of Perth⁽¹⁾; between the land of William Duchal on the west, and the land of Thomas Perrock on the east, for a certain sum of money which the said prior and convent in his necessity gratefully paid into his hands. — (1) On the back of the charter. — «Now John Lowry's land in 1590»; and in a more moderne hand — «Now George Wilson's».

9. 1442, 17 June. — Thomas de Culgask ratifies a donation he had made on the 4th of July 1429, of eight shillings of annual rent out of his croft in the New Row, which donation he had granted in the second year of the foundation of the Carthusian Monastery, in which year he also gave a piece of land called the Ridge, a part of the ground on which the monastery was erected. —

10. 1444. — John de Fotheringham, burgher of Perth, grants to the Carthusian monastery an annual rent of thirteen shillings and four pennies out of the land of Thomas Gilbert, also an entire tenement on the south side of the North Street of Perth, burdened with annual rents to several burghers. — On the back of the charter, in an old hand — « (2) ».

11. 1450, 4 May. — L'antewordit dant l'introduction page 211: «Another general council (parliament) was held at Perth on the 6th of May 1450, in which was ratified the charter of foundation of the Carthusian monastery, or House of the Valley of Virtue. the west, for the annual payment of thirteen shillings for premises to the chaplain of St. Nicholas' altar, and twenty shillings yearly to the charterhouse; the said Thomas and his heirs not to sell or alienate the said tenement, nor sell or mortgage any annual rent out of it, without the consent of the Prior and his successors. —

On the back of the charter, written in an old hand, either by one of the monk, or by David Thomson, the notary-public — « Copia littere terroe quondam, Johannis Elder in Via Australi Burgi de Perth. » —

18. 1461-2, 11 Febr. — Sir Henry Robertson, Vicar of Auchtergaven and chaplain of the Holy Rood altar in the parish church of Perth, grants + to prior Simon Fernely and the Carthusian monastery, with consent of Andrew Spens, a certain tenement, with its pertinents, on the north side of the South Street of Perth, between the tenements of Maurice Brown, weaver, and of Sir John Sprunt, chaplain, on the west and east. —

19. 1464, 30 April. — William Hume, burgher of Perth, sells to the Carthusian monastery an annual rent of twelve shillings out of the land of the late James Brown on the north side of the South Street, between the land of John Lyall on the east, and the common Yarnel, extending to the church, which is commonly called the Rotton-Row, on the west; and Alexander Scott, one of the Bailies of the burgh of Perth, gave legal seizin and possession to Dean Andrew Zelfer, procurator at the time of the said monastery, in name of the prior and convent. —

20. 1464, 10 Dec. — Andrew Constable, burgher of Perth, sells to the prior and convent of the House of the Valley of Virtue of the Carthusian order, near the said burgh, a gild rood of his land lying without the said burgh on the west side of the pavement or King's Street, extending to the chapel of St. Leonard, between the crofts of the lands of St. Leonard on the north and south, from the said pavement on the east to the croft commonly called Leonard Ley on the west, of which Alexander Bunch, one of the + Bailies of Perth, gave legal seizin and possession to Dean Simon Fernely, prior of the said Carthusian House, in name of himself and his convent.

21. 1468, 2 August. - Alexander Cowan, burgher of Perth, obtained in
+ feu from Andrew Lelfer, humble prior of the House of the Valley of
Virtue of the carthusian order near Perth, with assent and consent
of the convent, their whole and entire tenement in the New Row,
between the tenement of James Scott on the north, and the road
to Stirling on the south, for the annual payment of thirteen shil-
-lings four pennies to the chaplain of St. Paul's chapel, and sixteen
shillings eight pennies to the carthusian monastery. -

22. 1471-2, 26 febr. - James III à la communaute de Perth.

the Prior of the Charterhouse, or Convent of the Valley of Virtue, was to receive the decimas garbales et pediales of certain lands both cultivated and incultivated. — Tract on Monastic Antiquities relative to Dunfermline, by Sir John Graham Dalyell, Bart. in Edinb. 1809 p. 33. —

The foundation of the Charterhouse of Perth was considered a splendid event, if we are to credit the rhyming legend —

« Anus millesimus vicesus sicque novenus,
quadringentus scotis fort muneris plenus;
semina florum, germina morum, mystica mella,
cum tibi, Scotia, fit Coenobia sponsa novella. »

Oswald de Corda, Vicar of the Great Charterhouse of Grenoble, was the first Prior of the House of the Valley of Virtue at Perth. He died on the 1st of October 1434, and was succeeded by Adam, de Hangleside, a Scotman. The last ecclesiastical Prior was Adam Foreman, who after the dissolution retired with his brethren to Erroll, of which church they were patrons, and he there fixed, with consent of the fraternity, to John Foreman, son and heir of Robert Foreman of Luthrie, the lands of the Chapel of St. Mary Magdalene called the lands of Friarton, the lands of Craigie, the South Island of the burgh of Perth in the Tay, and his salmon fishings in that river. On the 14th of November 1569 the Prior and convent conveyed to John Mowrieff the place, house, whole and entire lands, orchards, and gardens of the Charterhouse, the close and ditch, the dars or bulwarks, with their tithes, within the bounds limited by ancient custom; also two tenements within the burgh, and tenements and gardens without the same.

This was confirmed to James Mowrieff on the 18th of May 1578. Subsequently George Hay of Nethercliff (Lord Chancellor of Scotland in 1622, created Viscount Dupplin and Lord Hay in 1627, and Earl of Kinnoull in 1633) was constituted commendator of the Charterhouse, with a vote and place in Parliament, together with « all and sundry churches, lands — sheaffs

-sheaffs, and other tithes belonging or con justly belong to the said Priory, with the principal manor place, buildings, gardens, and orchards within the precinct and enclosure of the Monastery of the Charterhouse. On the 1st of February 1598, James VI granted to George Hay of Netherdill the church lands of Erroll on resigning his title of Lord Prior of the Charterhouse.

It appears from some old record that the Carthusians were earlier at Perth than 1429, though that was probably the year of the erection of the Charterhouse. James I, who was murdered in the court of the Black Friars at Perth, was interred in the church of the Charterhouse as were also his Queen Jane, grand-daughter of John of Gaunt, third son of Edward III, and, as previously mentioned, Margaret, Queen of James IV, and daughter of Henry VII. The doublet in which James I was murdered was kept in the Charterhouse as a relic. It was preserved after reformation, and Gall relates that he had seen in it the holes through which the King was stabbed to the heart. —

18. — The Carthusian Monks of Perth always maintained a good reputation, and adhered strictly to the rules of their order. One of them was Patrick Russell, who continued Fordun's History of Scotland. — Hactenus the Book of Perth. —

19. — Altar of St. Gregory and St. Augustine. — April 20, 1529. — Sir James Young, vicar of Pitcairn, founded an altar and chaplaincy in honour of St. Gregory and St. Augustine at the altar of all saints in the parish church of Perth, and endowed the same with annual sum of fifty marks, or £. 10, out of the two entire tithements lately erected by him on the south side of the South Street. (Mr. 160th says of the altar of St. Gregory and St. Augustine — "The satire of its annual rents was dated november 3, 1532. Its rent at the reformation was 16s. 1d. sterling. The prior of Charterhouse appears to have been patron, for after the

after the reformation there was a gift from the prior of the charterhouse of St. Gregory's and St. Augustine's Altar to Henry Drummond, son to James Drummond, Sheriff-clerk of Perth, during his lifetime, dated 23 April 1574, which was resigned to the Kirk-session in favour of King James VI's Hospital. There was also what was called St. Gregory's Mass, or altar, pertaining to ten choisters of Perth, or nine clerks, the tenth, with advice of the Provost, founded by Sir John Myreton, Prebendary of Forquardenny. The rent of St. Gregory's Mass, as given by Sir Robert Rhynd after the reformation, was 18 s. 0 $\frac{1}{2}$ d. Sterling. —

Page 81. — The Nunnery of St. Leonard the Abbot, with its chapel and Hospital, was a short distance south-west of the town, and was founded before 1296. After the erection of the Carthusian monastery this Nunnery was suppressed, and its lands and rents were conferred on the Carthusians, who continued the chapel under their patronage. (Note: About A.D. 1396, Gilbert Taylor, burgess of Perth, granted an annual rent of forty pennies to the Hospital of St. Leonard out of a tenement on the south side of the north-street, which was afterwards acquired by the Carthusian monastery.) — Lady Elizabeth Dunbar, daughter of George tenth Earl of Dunbar and March, became Prioress of the Nunnery in 1611. an Hospital, to be called in all time coming King James' Hospital of
Perth » (New Statistical Account of Scotland — Perthshire, pag. 67). — This is some-
-thing like the King's subsequent claim to be considered the Founder of the
University of Edinburgh. At the date of the above transaction, the King was
not two years old, and the idea of the Regent Moray edifying his infant
Majesty with his advice, or consulting him, in the subject, is too preposterous
to be

to be supposed for a moment. The whole property of the religious Houses of Perth seems either to have been usurped by individuals, or to have fallen into abeyance, from the time of their destruction in May 1559 till 1587, when James VI, who had then attained his majority, confirmed the foundation of the Regent Moray, which previously had his Majesty's mere nominal concurrence, by a new charter, and both were legalized by an act of the Scottish Parliament held at Holyroodhouse on the 29th of July in the above year. *l'interparle unites de l'Hopital et d'une un extrait de l'acte du 29 juillet 1587. - apres avoir mentionné la donation des biens des Dominicains, des frères Mineurs et des carmes, il ajoute :*

Immediately after the charter was granted, the Minister and Kirk-session, as Managers of the Hospital, entered on possession of the Black-Friars' Charterhouse, and other lands; but the value of this splendid endowment was more apparent than real, and the Hospital obtained a very limited share of the ancient ecclesiastical property of Perth. was empty, and the choicest pictures removed - not a monk was to be
seen. - While the populace were demolishing the few articles of furni-
-ture which remained, Oliver observed a part of the wainscoting open,
gently, and rapidly close again. Pointing this out to some of his com-
-panions

-panions, they without difficulty detected the concealed door, forced it open, and descending a narrow flight of steps found themselves in a large dimly-lighted vault, on the floor of which, amidst a profusion of shells, and other relics of viands more dainty than the rules of the order exactly warranted, the costly glass of the monastery was lying in heaps. The monks assembled there at first offered resistance, which from the narrowness of the entrance might easily have been made effectual; but on being reminded that if the part of the building above them were pulled down they must inevitably perish amidst the ruins, they came to terms with their invaders. Through their representations, the conservatory immediately above the vault, with its far-famed gateway, was, of all the monastic buildings in Perth, alone saved; and to the timely caution of the Observantine Brethren Perth owed the preservation of that beautiful gateway, which was removed to, and was long deemed the chief ornament of St. John's church. - Oliver, satisfied with having been instrumental in saving one fragment of the finest building ⁱⁿ Scotland, and little dreaming that the successor of his friend Johnston in the civic chair would in less than a century join in ordering the demolition of that solitary memorial of departed greatness^(a); now directed his steps homewards, and as he passed down the South Street, met a party of the destructives emerging from an arched way leading to the Chapel of the Holy Rood... etc.

But James's most prominent act as benefactor of the church was the founding and endowing of the great Carthusian convent of Perth, the only establishment of that order which ever existed in Scotland, generally known as the "Vallis virtutis" or "Vallis virtutum," though at first called in the rolls "Claravallis". The original letter sent to the King by the Prior of the Grand Chartreuse, of date 19th August 1426 - now in possession of the hospital of Perth - authorised the erection of a house of the order at Perth, for the accommodation of thirteen monks and a competent number of servants, who were to serve God perpetually for the souls of the King and Queen, and the heirs, predecessors, and successors of the King. The King engaged to endow the house with 200 marks, to guarantee to it the privileges and liberties of the order, and to cause it to be built in accordance with the requirements of the order, as explained by the Prior of the Mount of Grace of Lugilby in Yorkshire, and by Dean Brice (Wycht) of the same house. Friar Oswald de Corda, vicar of the Grand Chartreuse of Grenoble, was the first Prior, a man, according to Borow, famed for his learning and his saintly life. Of the many payments which appear in the accounts towards the building of this monastery, not a few are made from the tax raised for the King's ransom, namely, 100 nobles paid to Dean Brice in 1429, 289 nobles to Friar John of Bute, a Cistercian, who seems to have had the charge of the building (p. 660), 93 nobles to the above named Friar Oswald (p. 640), and £40, 15. 8 d. Flemish paid by John Curyn at Bruges through the Prior of the Carthusian convent there (p. 678). Towards the same object £122 and £16 are paid in 1434 and 1435 from the customs of Perth (p. 563, 613); while the customs of Edinburgh are credited to the extent of £9, 3 s. for iron (p. 508), and £4, 10 s. for glass (p. 621) for the works. The Prior also gets from the King Muscadel wine to the value of £13, and

and Rhine wine to the value of £8. (p. 564).

Two ancient numeraries at Perth were suppressed by the King, and the convent endowed with their lands and revenues. One of them was the hospital of St. Leonard, where Lady Elizabeth Dunker, the rejected fiancée of the Duke of Rothesay, had been, Prioress; the other was the hospital of St. Mary Magdalene, lying in the southern outskirts of Perth. In the accounts of the bailies of Perth we find an annuity of £8 from the fermes of that town, which had from the days of Robert Bruce been paid to the former hospital, after being received for four years by the before mentioned Friar John of Bute (p. 488, 523, 524), probably for the new religious house, permanently devoted to its use in 1434 (p. 632): and from 1435 we find the same diversion of the smallest annuity received by the hospital of St. Mary Magdalene (p. 632).

The Carthusians of Perth seem always to have maintained a good reputation and adhered to the rules of their order. Their convent was entirely destroyed at the Reformation, and the hospital of James VI built nearly on its site. —

Creatures were instigated by his virulent language).
